Heroines of Film and Television: Portrayals in Popular Culture is a book I've been hoping would have been done years ago. While there are numerous good recent works about television and heroism, most are decidedly one sided and favor men over women, ignoring many of the immensely complicated and nuanced female heroines who have been the *real* story on television ever since the premier of *Buffy* back in 1997.

This anthology takes on Buffy, of course, but casts its net wider, looking not only at Buffy (through the lens of political economy), but also looks at heroines in less obviously fantastic worlds (*Madmen*'s Joan Harris) as well as looking at heroines on a global scale from Bollywood to Japanese anime to the differing movie versions of Lisbeth Salander in *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo*. The wide variety of critical approaches and methodologies and the comprehensiveness of this book make it an essential addition to the library of anyone seriously studying gender, television and popular culture.
