## **Editorial Review**

#### From Publishers Weekly

Beer, class and protest intersect in Keizer's (No Place but Here) creative but not completely successful first novel, about teens in rural Vermont. Led by Quaker Oats, the intellectual pal of "towny" narrator Kyle, a group of friends forms SUDS, or Students Undermining a Drunk Society; the group strives to "lower the drinking age, raise the drinker's awareness [and] destroy the non-drinker's stigma" through nonviolent protest. They hold a party at which guests choose mystery drinks that may be alcoholic or not, and recycle trashed bottles. Momentum builds, but when the local golden girl, Diana, is killed driving a drunk guy home, the group and their rebellion falls apart. Tensions only escalate when "redneck" David is arrested for smashing beer bottles at a convenience store because they contained what killed his friend. Keizer handles high school society expertly (at Diana's funeral, the students play "Candle in the Wind" and one reads a bad poem), and he brings the right details to his characterizations of the teens' families, all of whom occupy different places within the town's social strata. The flaws are those of excess: the author juggles more conflicts than he can quite handle and introduces more characters than he can gracefully track. Even so, his story has the ring of authenticity; it's a promising debut. Ages 13-up.

Grade 8 Up-From the sobering dedication, "For those I taught, the living and the dead," to the predictable but necessary car-crash plot, an interesting cast of teen and adult characters populates this story set in rural Vermont. High school senior Kyle feels average, but has friends who excel. "Ouaker" Oats is smart and a committed pacifist. Beautiful Diana is their longtime best friend, Kyle's unrequited love, and a good person. David is a redneck, backwoods hunter given to rages that Kyle and his friends often try to assuage. Newcomer Condor is inexplicably nasty to David. For a class project, Quake and the gang create an unofficial nonviolent social protest they call the Beer Rebellion, or SUDS: Students Undermining a Drunk Society. They cite three goals: "Lower the drinking age, raise the drinker's awareness, and destroy the nondrinker's stigma." During a party, Condor gets drunk and sober Diana is killed while driving him home. David rages, emptying the coolers of beer at the mini-mart, smashing bottles in the parking lot until arrested. At his trial, Quake follows suit in the courtroom. Kyle watches them work through their subsequent community service, gains a better understanding of Condor, and wrestles with his own choices. The plot wanders around, leaving readers a little unsettled about what the kids are really trying to accomplish. However, the book does mirror their attempts to reconcile our society's conflicting and often hypocritical attitudes. This message in a bottle is a brave, if uneven, attempt to provoke thought about this difficult, oftignored matter.
