Nabokov is a master, his place in the pantheon assured. This play, discovered among his papers and first published in Russia in 1997, is considered his first major work, as the translators explain in their cogent introduction, as it contains in nascent form his principal themes. It is a tragedy that owes a debt to Shakespeare, which the nimble, readable translation makes explicit with its use of loose iambic pentameter. The work contains swerving turns of phrase and ringing contrasts that hint at the glorious writing of the mature Nabokov: "... An ant.../Funny, he runs like a man amidst a fire...." This is a work of juvenilia that will attract the specialist and the completist. The speeches often curdle into speechifying, and the work is wildly uneven. The elements are simple enough: a nameless kingdom, a quartet of love stories, nihilistic revolutionaries. But the story of revolt for revolt's sake is powerful, and the play's strength is how it dramatizes this excruciating truth. --Michael Autrey
